



# ***SNOWPLOW OPERATIONS***

Calaveras County Department of Public Works staff work diligently to complete snow removal operations as quickly and safely as possible. Snowplow operations start when snow reaches depths of 3" on roadways in Arnold, West Point, Glencoe, Avery, Railroad Flat, and Mountain Ranch. Camp Connell and Dorrington operations start with 2" of snow on the roadways.

During a storm, major collector and arterial roads take priority. From there, minor collector and all other roads are plowed. Snowplow operations may be delayed due to downed trees and/or power lines. Once obstacles are removed, snow removal operations will resume.

The creation of berms are unavoidable due to turning limitation of plows and must be removed by the resident. Between storms the snowplows will continue to push snow off the roadway shoulder to prevent travel lanes from becoming dangerously narrow.

Parking or standing of vehicles on the County maintained right-of-way during snow removal is prohibited. CHP will cite and/or remove any such vehicle at the owner's expense. Driving closely behind a snowplow is discouraged as snowplow drivers make frequent stops and back up maneuvers.
